## Instructions for the Abstract Contest

- 1. **Submit an abstract only if your project is an experiment**. Do not submit an abstract for a collection, model, or demonstration.
- 2. **The abstract should be written by the student(s)**. For team projects (two or three students), submit one abstract with all the students' names on a single abstract form.
- 3. Language: English.
- 4. **Content:** Your abstract should briefly summarize or highlight the major points of your project, including, in order, your **Purpose**, **Procedures**, **Data and/or Results**, **Conclusion**, and **Reflections or Application**. Use this as a checklist to make sure your abstract is complete.
- 5. **Format:** An abstract should be one continuous paragraph. There is no need for "decoration" such as headings, paragraph breaks, labels, or graphics.
- 6. **Length:** Your abstract should be **between 100 and 250 words**. Abstracts longer than 250 words will be disqualified from winning a cash prize. Yes, judges count words!
- 7. **This is a fillable PDF**. You can digitally enter your information and abstract text directly into the form. A scan or photo of a hand-written abstract will also be accepted with this form as a cover page.
- 8. When you finish this form, save it with a helpful identifying file name, then upload the filled form (or scan or photo of the form and hand-written abstract) along with your other project materials to the online science fair registration platform before the event.
