



2020 Online Registration and Project Check-In Schedule

Online registration by March 26; Project Check-In March 27, 2020

Judging event March 28; Awards Ceremony March 29, 2020 (for these, see the main event schedule)

The Alaska Science & Engineering Fair (ASEF) is an Alaska state-wide science fair. It is open to all grade K-12 students in Alaska. It is not necessary to participate in a local school fair before ASEF. A single student, team of two, or team of three may present one project in person.

Before the Fair: Online Registration

IMPORTANT! Register online on or before Thursday, March 26, 2020 at www.alaskasciencefair.org! Online registration will be open in March 2020.

Single students and teams of two or three, please coordinate with your teacher/mentor/parents/grandparents/guardians/team members to **register just one time per project**.

If you register online by Thursday, March 26, your printed materials will be ready and your Project Check-In will take less time. If you miss the online registration deadline, register online anyway and attend Friday's Project Check-In, but be aware it will take longer.

Friday, March 27, 2020, 5PM—8PM: Project Check-In

The Northway Mall, Burlington Coat Factory entrance, 3101 Penland Pkwy.

Arrive to check in your project any time between 5PM and 8PM. Allow about one hour to complete the check-in process, but it may take more or less time depending on how busy it is.

- Bring: 1. Project display board.** Limit one project per entrant. An entrant may be a single student or a team of two or three students. Larger teams are not allowed.
- 2. Forms/paperwork.** See the website to find out which forms are required for your grade level and project subject.
- 3. Optional second copy of your abstract with abstract form*.**

* **Abstracts** to present and keep with your project are **required for grades 9-12**, strongly recommended for grades 7-8, and encouraged for grades 4-6. Abstracts are not necessary for (and there is no contest for) grades K-3.

To enter the **optional Abstract Writing Contest** for grades 4-12, turn in a **second copy of your abstract** stapled to a **signed Abstract Form** at Project Check-In. Abstract forms and information are available at www.alaskasciencefair.org.

Late Check-In: Students who know they will miss Project Check-In on Friday must register online by Thursday, March 26, and their teacher/chaperone must arrange with the Director Director@alaskasciencefair.org for late Project Check-In.
