Public Viewing Policy

The public is invited to view the projects on Saturday only, as long as such viewing does not interfere with the judging process.

Public viewing is a privilege allowed at the Alaska Science & Engineering Fair, because we believe the students’ work is wonderful and deserves to be widely viewed. We ask parents, siblings, teachers, and the public to observe the following courtesies:

- **Do not stand near projects for general conversation.**
- **Do not allow younger siblings or friends to play near the projects.**
- **Keep your distance and do not try to overhear judging interviews.**

Parents and teachers, we know it’s tempting to listen to the judging interviews, but please stay at the sidelines instead. Ask your student later about the judging interviews.

You can help us reduce congestion, make students more comfortable, and speed up the judging sessions.
